MISSION

The Ministry and its agencies will contribute to achieve the following key outcome targets

Key outcome targets in 2026

- Improve living conditions of underserved settlements from the rate of 18% in 2022 to 22%.
- Improve living conditions of other amenities from the rate of 15% in 2022 to 20%.
- Improve compliance to planned city development and reach minimum compliance rate of 80% in 2022 to 95%.
- Optimization of land use in urban cities from the rate of 32% in 2022 to 36%.
- Improve conservation and sustainable use of wetlands in the Western province from 19km² in 2022 by 10%
- Improve customer satisfaction of institutions that come under the ministry and reach Average level (50%) to Good (75%) by all agencies / departments under the ministry.
- Improve financial performance of SOEs that come under the Ministry from their level in 2022 by at least 20%.
- Improve living conditions of 315 condominium properties from existing level to 74%.
- Reduce marine environmental pollution from the existing level by 60%.
- Reduction of Coastal disaster risk level due to coastal erosion in every year by at least 50% annually with construction of coast protective structures and emergency protection.
- Improve flood mitigation in urban flood prone areas by 12% from its current level and reduce annual incidences from 40 to 10.
